You won't find Humpty Dumpty in this boy's room designed by Polly Anne Reiter, but it offers durable surfaces and plenty of storage for books and toys. The area also doubles as a guest room for an adult visitor. Instead of using juvenile prints, Polly Anne incorporates elements that are attractive to all ages.

The designer chose a baby-blue wall paint, but elevated its sophistication with masculine brown drapery panels in a houndstooth pattern. At the foot of the tailored beds, benches covered in polka dots animate the room without making it silly. "Polka dots are versatile, classic, and fun," Polly Anne says. "You could use the benches for extra seating anywhere."
