Yet the artist's wheel-thrown, carved porcelain forms reflect a more alluring symbiosis of material and suggestion. The intimacy of hand-produced art—the slip dots, luster and metalwork all made in Southern California—summons curiosity but also feels stirringly familiar. An extension of Anton's Utility collection of functional pottery and accessories, the pieces have the sculptural resonance of design and surprise—something only the handcrafted arts know.
